

Children's Initiative



Everything is learned behaviour. If we want our children to understand that everyone does not grow up with the privileges that they take for granted; that change starts with all of us and not a laissez-faire attitude; that help can come from anyone, anywhere at any time. ..then we must show them the way. This must be part of life and not a special event.

The Bible, Quran and Torah are all pretty clear on giving. We should do it from the heart without looking for recognition or reward.

soap4all can be a catalyst to start the conversation about giving with your children.

As I was working on the site my daughter walked past and said "Errr..that man's hands are so dirty".

When I asked my children to go into their bedrooms and pick a few things to give to a little boy who had no toys, my son came out with 4 bits of broken kinder surprise/McDonalds happy meal toys and held them out with the expression of one who had just made a great sacrifice.

I realised that they just don't know.

Children do not understand but are a canvass that we can impress upon with good, strong values that will carry them through life creating a wonderful spirit of generosity.

What do you teach your children about giving? Do they really get it? How judgemental are they of those who are dirty and smelly. As adults we understand the awful stories that lie behind poverty and homelessness. We don't have to use adult language but how can we teach them to see beyond what is on the surface?

Here's how soap4all can help you start this conversation with your children:

At home

- 1) Collect the unwanted toiletries you have at home and explain why you are doing it.
- 2) At the Supermarket. The value brands are usually on the bottom shelf. Get children to put 5 toothbrushes for 35p in the trolley and talk about who those will go to.
- 3) In the car: We are just a family who had an idea. What ideas do your children have about how we could help people with less? As you are driving along acknowledge people on the streets. We like to sprinkle prayers on them. Come up with your own thing and turn it into a game.
- 4) Volunteer as a family and spend one evening putting toiletries into bags.

Here are some conversation starters:

How would you feel if you were dirty and smelly?	How would you feel if other people were mean to you because of how you looked and smelt?
What could you do to help other people?	What if the people you help never know that the help came from you?

At School

We welcome and encourage support from schools.

Ways to help:

Have a drop box (please see the get involved section on soap4all.com and under corporate there is a link to a PDF with tools such as posters and email templates to get you started.

Use this as a learning exercise creating a lesson plan around the spirit of giving. Veronica and Max are our two schools liaisons. Please contact us if you would like advice on implementing this at your school.

Do a class or school volunteer activity by sitting on the floor and bagging up the toiletries you have collected.

All our toiletry packs all get delivered with a note on that we hope will bring the recipient a little comfort and let them know that complete strangers are thinking about them and care. Get children to write their own and attach to their bags.

Why not do a non uniform day in exchange for soap!

Getting Started

Step 1: If you are a parent, please make sure you check with the appropriate internal channels at school to ask permission and ensure their involvement is approved. Please direct the approver to our website, soap4all.com for more information.

Step 2: Once approved you just need to build awareness among staff and children about this charitable activity. Please see the attached flyer and suggested email which you can amend as required. If you would like the word version of these documents please ask.

Step 3: Print out the attached box coversheet and attach to any box. We suggest you start with a small one. You do not have to have the box on display. If you think it is unsightly or inconvenient keep the box in a storage area out of sight and just have a sign on a desk letting people know the details of where to leave them.

Step 4: Once your box is full, please email us to let us know and we will advise you of your nearest Hoarder. A soap4all Hoarder is a volunteer that stores the toiletries that come in and then arranges for other volunteers to come and help put them into individual packs. If you have an employee who would like to be a Hoarder that can work really well as that person becomes an internal champion talking it up and increasing awareness.

Step 5: Once we receive your box we will email you a letter of gratitude letting you know how many packs were made from the items you donated. This is helpful information to include in your internal communications such as newsletters et al.

Tip:

Please make sure that people know exactly what we can accept which is only: soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shower gel, shampoo, deodorant and ear buds.
